## The Eighth Day

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you."

I'm not sure why English Bible translations of the last century have all taken a pass on this, but the ESV gives us a very literal translation. Maybe the others thought it was just too much information (TMI). Or a needless detail that might otherwise cloud up a very clear passage. The NIV just says "a week later" instead of "eight days later".

The Old Testament invests some significance in the eighth day. The covenant of circumcision was performed on the eighth day—the day when they became part of God's chosen people. When a leper thought that he was healed of his disease, he would show himself to the priest who could declare him to be clean only after eight days had passed. When Solomon's temple was built, the people celebrated for an entire week, and then the next day, the eighth day, the temple was dedicated, while the cloud of God's glory and His presence filled the Holy of Holies. The eighth day was set aside for consecration, for deliverance, for cleansing, for healing, for restoration. The eighth day is the start of something new....beyond the ordinary...even something extraordinary.

Easter is our eighth day. It is the beginning of something new. A new creation! The very One who created Adam on the sixth day and breathed into his flesh the breath of life, now suffers in His flesh on the cross and breathes His last on that

same day—Good Friday. The One who rested on the seventh day from all His work of creation, now rests in a tomb on that same day—Holy Saturday. The next day—the eighth day— sees angels greet the women at Jesus' empty tomb with these words: "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen! Remember how He told you while He was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise" Luke 24:5–6. And the reason or purpose of this? St. Paul answers: "Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of those who have fallen asleep.... For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive" 1 Corinthians 15:20, 22.

Since the early church we gather on the anniversary of the resurrection for worship. Every Lord's Day is an eighth day. It is the beginning of a new creation. The hope of eternal life! On this day the Lord gives his gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation to sustain us into everlasting life. In the divine service and through the word and sacraments – He consecrates, restores, and dedicates people like you and me to Himself forever.

Happy eight day! Live in the new life that never ends! And all of us sustained by God.

#### More Than a Negative

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without technically lying. You tell just enough of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing how close we can get to sinning without technically going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people — we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our

relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.
